From the Editor:

We have tried in the past to limit the newsletter to fourteen pages, but you will notice that this one is much larger. The editor came to the point of either adding pages or eliminating stories. He ended up adding pages. The amount of material Root Seekers and others have supplied is amazing. Due to lack of space, it became necessary to put some articles on the back burner to be used later. However, just because we have to hold some articles for later should not deter anyone from doing his/her part.

In the last issue, I mentioned some suggestions for articles. I have another I would like to offer with some ideas about content, formatting, and length.

Almost everyone of us has made a pedigree chart for our children and/or grandchildren. Why don't you offer that for publication and add to it by reducing pictures to fit the pedigree? Think of what it will mean to them to have their pedigree and picture published; not to mention the pride you will have in doing it.

The second suggestion concerns content. Words are fine and acceptable, but think of what a picture, birth certificate, or some other memento would add to the article. If you have several grandchildren born in different parts of the country or world, a little map showing where each was born would add. This can be integrated into the grandchild's pedigree. Look at the article about the "Scotts of Tolosa"; pictures, marriage

certificate, Bible pages, as well as pedigree. Don't you have similar items in your files? Did you read the letter from Judge Tate in the last issue? Notice the article, "Does Your Horse Have Colic?" in this issue. That prescription was found tucked in my uncle's journal and was written by my Grandfather Self. Such items like this are welcome for publication.

The next suggestion comes from a discovery I made when Betty Watson Anderson of Mabank gave me a picture taken in the 50's in front of my wife's grandparents' house. She had taken the original to Graphics, Etc in Gun Barrel City to copy. It was so well done I decided to try to copy and enlarge some old pictures. Two 2.5 x 4 inch tintypes were enlarged to 11 x 17. (You know. Tintypes were photos printed on metal plates back between 1865 and 1885.) The copies showed every wrinkle, crinkle, and blemish; just what I wanted. I had some color copies made of other pictures; every one turned out better than I could have ever hoped. I thought if enlarging worked this well, why not try reducing. The Bible pages, pictures, and other items in the Scott story of the April-June issue are the result after I scanned them for the newsletter. The cost? It ran 50c for each black and white copy and \$1.75 for the large color copy.

The next suggestion is about formatting for the newsletter. If possible, and I emphasize, if possible, please limit your pedigree to two or three pages; leave a two inch margin at the top and a one inch margin at the bottom. This allows room for a header and a footer. If you cannot format the data to these specifications, do not be concerned; we will work with whatever you can produce.

I am anxious to see what the July issue is going to contain. Ed.
